Read in three columns of ten, letters in (a) 2nd, (b) 4th & (c) last positions spell a clue to historical character D.

- 1 (Two on Film...) The name of *which* title character from an ongoing film franchise (2001-) is taken from the German word for “fright” or “terror”?
- 2 ... and, in the EON Bond film *Die Another Day*, (a) *what* is the character nickname of Halle Berry’s character Giacinta Johnson, acquired because of her having been born on Friday 13th; and (b) *who* played 007?
- 3 What given name supplied the first A of Abba?
- 4 By *what* two-word name do we know the dish that (perhaps strangely) is known in Ukrainian, Russian and Polish cuisines as “côtelette de volaille”?
- 5 In the lyrics to a well-known song, *what* six words precede “I’d run right into hell and back”; “I’d never lie to you and that’s a fact”; and “...but I won’t do that.”?
- 6 New Romney (or Rye), Hythe, Dover, Sandwich – and *which* one other?
- 7 Best known as Aristotle’s Peripatetic school of philosophy, *which* Athenian temple gave its name to the London theatre that has staged *The Lion King* since 1999?
- 8 With credits as guest panellist on e.g. *Have I Got News for You*, *Would I Lie to You?*, *Never Mind the Buzzcocks* and *Question Time*, *whose* breakthrough act at the Edinburgh Fringe in 1995 was entitled “Short, Fat, Kebab Owner’s Son”?
- 9 The *Polemonium* flower, a device in the physics lab, the title of a Brian Keaney novel and the title of a 1990 Tim Robbins film all share their two-word name with *which* object of a Biblical dream?
- 10 Proverbially, if not legally (considering farmer Tony Martin’s shooting of a burglar in 2000 and subsequently serving three years in prison), *what* “is his castle” (2,11,4)?
