2942	(i) STUB for STUM <i>He must shave the end off soft pencil</i> STUM(P); ('He' was superfluous) (ii) MOULT for MOUNT 'Horse feathers' (one of the variations) = mount + down	(41 : 64 : 177) (16 : 64 : 177)
2943	GROIN for PROIN <i>Milord <u>now</u> fat, once trim, would <u>die of suffocation</u> in tights</i> DLM answer is DROWN; P, I replace D, W to give PROIN = once trim	(49 : 55 : 242)

- 2963 (i) Clue number(s) misplaced (18 : 35 : 305)
 (ii) Clue number(s) missing (18 : 35 : 305)
- 2965 (i) Equation under the grid made unsatisfactory use of the four fours and the various mathematical terms appearing in the grid (131 : 138 : 207)
 (ii) GLEAM for FLEAM (41 : 138 : 207)
Flash, extinguished at the outset by foot instrument
 F for G in GLEAM
- 2968 TEAPOT for TEAPOY (18 : 24 : 183)
Caddy, by confusion a poet writ wrongly
 Anag. A POET, almost verbatim definition from Chambers.
 Last letter not indicated – all 26 letters were answer ends
- 2970 TRACERY for THACKRY (104 : 115 : 196)
 RACE (= course) should be replaced by HACK (= horse) despite the significant letters being unchecked
